

One year while delivering food baskets to needy families at Thanksgiving. I experienced true gratitude when a small child (6 or 7 years old) came up to me and hugged my legs, looked up and thanked me for helping his family. That moment so simple, so powerful, captured why we do what we do. Our lodge would provide groceries enough to feed a family for a week, it may not sound like much but it was what we could afford with our budget and donations from members. We did the same at Christmas and later added gifts for the children. It wasn't extravagant, but the joy in their eyes was priceless.

Our veterans hold a special place in my heart. At every function, I shake each of their hands and thank them. Often, they'll hold on tightly, tears in their eyes, thanking us for remembering them. It's humbling and unforgettable.

I choose to work on the committees that mean the most to me at my lodge and at the state level. I have created a few different committees at my lodge that help our communities and that in turn has gotten the Elks name out into the community, as we aren't known for advertising our good deeds.

I believe this with my whole heart: You only get out of something what you're willing to put into it. And what I've received in return has enriched my life tenfold. The bar and pool (if you have one) are only fringe benefits of being a member of the Elks Lodge. So I ask that you choose to get involved to some extent and help to lighten the burden of those already working. It really takes very little time, just pick a committee that you are interested in. If you can't give time, give a donation. Every bit counts.

Whether you are a new member or older like myself, you can make a positive impact on your lodge and community, I did.




Saturday Morning Americanism Program





Our 3 State winners will receive \$2,000 each plus a weekend at Jekyll Island to attend our Annual Meeting of the Ga. Elks Association and receive their Awards. 
